### Recreation Facility Pass Program for Veterans, Reservists and Active Duty Military Personnel

Program benefits: A one-time free 90-day pass to city of Boulder recreation facilities for post-9/11 veterans who are City of Boulder residents.

A 25% discount on adult and senior annual passes through the Group Discount Program, for all military personnel that reside in the City of Boulder or Boulder County, Colorado. The program is not retroactive for current pass holders.

Qualifications: Service in one of the following branches of service, identified by the Department of Defense: Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, National Guardor Merchant Marines.

Residency: The one-time free 90-day pass is limited to City of Boulder residents.

25% discount program: City residents – 25% discount on resident rate. Non-residents (Boulder County only) – 25% discount on resident rate if they work in Boulder; 25% discount on non-resident rate.

How to receive your free 90-day pass: Non-Active military VETS should go to the Iris Center front desk between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and show a DD-214 form with separation date after 9/11/2001.

How to receive a 25% discount through the Group Discount Program: Please show one of the following at a recreation center front desk to qualify for the 25% discount: DD-214 Form, Valid Veterans ID from the Veterans Affairs Office or Valid Active Duty or Reservist ID.




