# American Legion

Issues 9 & 10

I must call your attention to the photographs on the front page of the last issue of our bulletin. One was of our new flag pole and the other was an exceptional photograph of a formation of war birds that flew over our Post during the Memorial Day ceremonies. Both

photographs are attributed to the fine talent of our Post historian/photographer Perry Smith. Due to my oversight Perry was not credited with the traditional "by lines" he deserved. Hand salute to Perry Smith!

Under the current Post-9/11 GI Bill, veterans are covered

for full cost of in-state tuition and fees for public college and universities—but veterans are caught in the spider web of meeting individual schools "Domicile" requirements. One veteran was denied in-state tuition in North Carolina even though she was a legal resident who owned a home and paid state taxes. She was refused in-state tuition because she had not been "in state" for 12 consecutive months due to her military status

Many states, like Colorado, give service members and their spouse's in-state tuition but that condition is *not* extended to veterans. Once you cease to be on active duty your status with the state university changes. Honorably discharged members of the Armed Forces *moving permanently* to Colorado qualify for in-state tuition. To do this you must show "evidence of domicile." Domicile is defined as your true, fixed and permanent home and place of habitation. Domicile is a legal characteristic that everyone has but you can have only one domicile at any one time. This is the trap the North Carolina veteran fell into. There are nine points that are used to establish "domicile" in Colorado. The last point is listed as "...other factors particular to your situation may be considered also, and should be docu-

mented." Depending on which and how many points a veteran uses will determine if they are granted in-state tuition. There are also six points of non-Colorado domicile. If you fail to pay Colorado State tax, "fail to comply with any law imposing a

mandatory duty on a permanent resident," return to your former state, maintain a home in another state, are absent form Colorado for a prolonged time or "any other factor particular to your situation," you will not be considered as "Domiciled" in Colorado and cannot receive in-state tuition.

The average non-resident tuition rate at public 4-year schools is \$21,706 while resi-

dent rates average \$8,655. The U.S. Senate is currently discussing H.R. 357 G.I. Bill Tuition Fairness Act of 2013. If passed it, hopefully, will allow any honorably discharged veteran to receive in-state tuition at any state-run higher-education institution of their choice. Currently the American Legion, Paralyzed Veterans of America, Association of the United States Navy, Fleet Reserve Association and Military Officers Association of America are backing H.R. 357. This is an uphill battle. If passed the states are under no obligation to honor it. Each state establishes its own rules for in-state tuition. The schools cannot change it in any way. The wording is placed there by politicians and lawyers to protect the states from foreign citizens of other states from taking advantage of Colorado facilities. When a soldier takes the allegiance to defend the Unites States they do not become a soldier of Colorado. They become a soldier of the Unites States and should not be charged extra for an education because some lawyer thinks they are second class citizens of another state. An honorable discharge and a DD-214 should be all that is needed for in-state tuition.

That's just one old soldier's opinion.




